Upon placing reinsurance business with any non-eligible CBR, cedants are required to obtain a resolution of the board of directors ratifying such placement and file a certified copy with the IRDAI. The guidelines prescribe an "auto renewal" facility for CBRs that have been allotted the FRN under the eligible CBR category in the preceding financial year and provided they have a higher credit rating than the minimum credit rating specified under the Reinsurance Regulations.
